





Frequently Asked Questions

How old are the children in the foster care system?

Children in foster care can be as young as newborns and up to 18 years old.

Can foster parents use physical punishment on the foster child?

No. Physical punishment in any form is not allowed. Instead, foster parents are encouraged to use positive parenting techniques such as setting boundaries, explaining consequences, implementing time-out sessions, and removing privileges to encourage good behaviour.

Can expatriates/foreigners apply to be foster parents?

Yes. However, to minimise disruption to a child's stay with the foster family, expatriates/foreigners who apply to be foster parents should plan to remain in Singapore for at least the next three years.

How long do foster children stay with their foster families?

The duration varies and can range from a few months to several years. Each child's foster care arrangement is carefully planned based on their specific needs, with the goal of ensuring a safe reintegration into their natural families.

How are foster children matched to their foster families?

The matching process takes into consideration the needs of the foster child and the foster family's ability to care for the child.

Foster parents can indicate preferences such as age and gender of the child that they feel they can best care for.

Boys' Town Fostering Services (BTFS) is a fostering agency appointed by the Ministry of Social and Family Development in Singapore. It is also one of the six key services offered by Boys' Town, a Catholic charity founded by the Montfort Brothers of St. Gabriel in 1948.

Since 2015, BTFS has been recruiting and supporting foster families to provide safe, stable, and nurturing home environments for children and young persons in the foster care system. In 2019, BTFS expanded its services to include kinship care support, ensuring that children in kinship arrangements receive the stability and care they need.



Fostering in Singapore

The Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF) Fostering Scheme provides temporary alternative care for children under 18 who need a safe, stable, and nurturing home.

It aims to reunite these children with their birth families once they are able to resume care, or to provide long-term care for children whose parents are unable to care for them.

Am I Eligible?

You are required to fulfill the following criteria

- Be married and apply together as a couple
- Be at least 25 years old
- Be financially stable and medically fit to care for children
- Commit to providing a child-safe home environment
 This includes:
 - Refraining from the use of physical punishment such as caning or hitting
 - For children below the age of 13, ensuring window grilles are installed on all windows

To help foster parents defray the costs of caring for a foster child, MSF provides the following support:

- Fostering Allowance A monthly allowance of \$1,100 is provided for each foster child under your care, and \$1,500 for a foster child with special needs.
- Childcare, Student Care and Medical Subsidies
- Support from a Foster Care Worker
- Training Courses by Social Service Institute
- Emergency Hotline
- Childcare Leave Benefits

The Application Process

The entire application and assessment process takes about three months.

Assessments will be conducted to ensure that you and your family are

suited to care for a foster child.

These assessments include:

Interview session(s) – Besides interviewing you and your spouse, the appointed assessor will speak to all household members, including your domestic helper and tenant(s), to ensure that everyone is open and supportive of fostering.

Home Visit – The assessors will conduct a home visit to ensure that your home is safe for the child.

This includes checking home safety features such as window grilles if you would like to care for a child below 13 years old.

Medical Screening – Medical screening is required to ensure that you and your spouse are physically fit to care for a child.

Application Outcome

Following the assessments, your application will then be evaluated by MSF, and you will be informed of the outcome.

Training

Once your application is approved, you will officially become foster parents.

You and your spouse will be required to attend mandatory foundation and intermediate training courses, which are designed to equip you with the skills needed to support a foster child effectively.

When there is a suitable match between your family and a child in need of foster care, our team will contact you and provide key information about the child's background and needs.

You will then have the opportunity to discuss with your family and decide whether you are able to care for the child.
